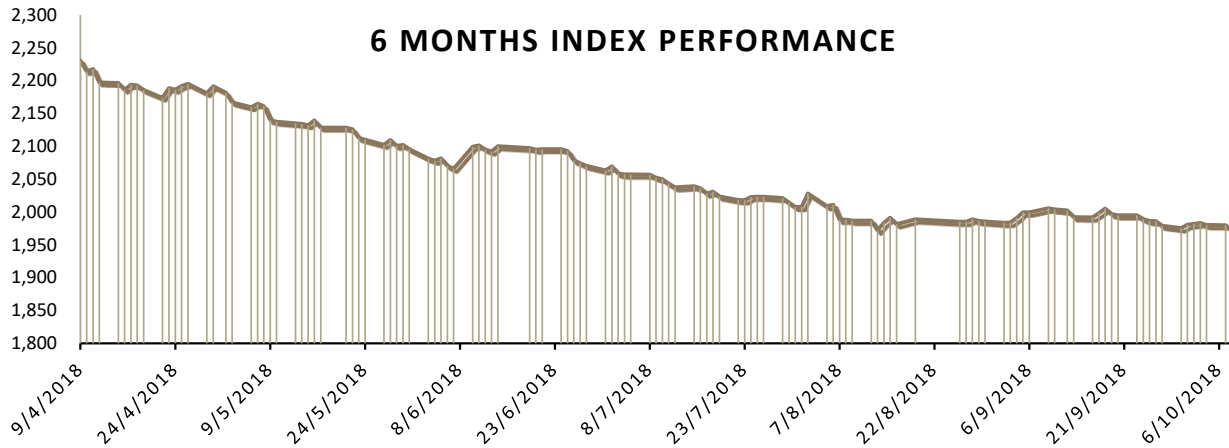

### CPF signs memo to launch second ICT competition in Jordan

The Crown Prince Foundation (CPF) on Monday signed a memorandum of understanding with Huawei, to launch the second edition of the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) Competition in Jordan. Huawei said in a statement, carried by the Jordan News Agency, Petra, that the announcement came at a ceremony attended by CPF CEO Tamam Mango, Senator Wajih Aweys and Chinese ambassador to Jordan, Pan Weifang. The second edition will run in Jordan and nine other countries in the Middle East.

### Brent crude oil prices rise sharply during September

Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources on Monday said that Brent oil prices witnessed a notable rise of 8.5 per cent at the beginning of October of the Jordan News Agency, Petra, reported. The price of a barrel of crude Brent oil rose from \$78.9 during September to \$85.5 at the beginning of October.

### Omar Jwaid appointed CEO of Jordan Industrial Estate Company

The Jordan Industrial Estate Company (JIEC) has decided to appoint Omar Jwaid as chief executive officer to succeed Jalal Dabai as of October 1, until the company appoints a new CEO, a JIEC statement said on Sunday. Jwaid assumed several monitoring and administrative posts, mainly as chief executive of the King Abdullah II Industrial Estate and executive director of the industrial estates that contributed to developing JIEC performance and serving various industrial investments within JIEC. The company has attracted 860 industrial firms with a total investment volume of some JD2.9 billion and provided more than 62,000 jobs.
